

Please enjoy our 10th Contemporary Glass Auction spanning over 19 years. Each auction is a unique experience. Last year we had two impressive collections that dominated nearly the entire auction; this year we offer works from 15 different collections. We are very selective when approving the auction works which is why it is not an annual event. Considering the diversity of sources, I am surprised that a theme has developed, different from our previous auctions. The unusual development this year is based on small works by a variety of artists. If you have a 10 X 10 inch space, 25 of the auction works would display comfortably. This auction carries on a tradition of three previous exhibits bases on small works, that we entitled "Scale/Detail". In my own home I have designed a special

area for my "miniature masters which I enjoy every day. This could be your start to a very special niche collection.

For the first time, we are auctioning something other than glass! You will have an opportunity to acquire the greatest privately owned library of glass publications in the United States. William



William Warmus has played a prominent role in studio glass since the mid-1970s as curator, art historian and author. In order to make space for new acquisitions, he is offering for sale a portion of his library of approximately 900 books, monographs, catalogs and other items.

The library includes a valuable run of the Journal of Glass Studies, auction catalogs, and difficult to find monographs from the former Czechoslovakia and other European countries, as well as books and exhibition catalogs documenting the emerging history of studio glass in the United States.





The following conditions of sale concern the items offered at the auction, including those listed in this catalogue. Habatat Galleries, Inc., reserves the right to determine the Terms of Sale, whether it be absentee bid, phone bid, internet bid or live auction.

ABSENTEE BIDS: If you cannot attend the sale, you may submit in writing an absentee bid on one or more objects. The auctioneer will bid for you by executing your absentee bid at the lowest possible price while taking into account the reserve and other bids. If two or more parties leave identical bids the first bid received by Habatat Galleries will take precedence.

TELEPHONE BIDS: Arrangements for telephone bidding should be confirmed at least 24 hours in advance of the sale. The staff of Habatat Galleries will execute telephone bids from designated areas in the showroom.

INTERNET BIDS: Images of the pieces will be hosted online and bids will be placed by email and must be received twenty four hours before the auction starts. If two or more parties leave identical bids the first bid received by Habatat Galleries will take precedence.

RESERVES: The reserve is the minimum price that the seller is willing to accept for their consigned objects, below which it will not be sold.

SALES TAX: All objects are subject to sales tax unless they are being shipped by common carrier out of state.

BUYERS PREMIUM: A premium of 15% (16% for payment by credit card) will be added to the successful bid price of all items sold at this auction. Auction items may be paid for by cash, check, wire transfer, Visa or MasterCard. Please note: All items bought at auction must be paid for, in full, at the auction's conclusion.
